



Rel. Technical Math – State Competition 2010

Where: DiSalle building, Hall C

When: Saturday April 24, 2010 -- 8:00 AM

Purpose: To evaluate the contestant's ability to solve mathematical problems commonly found in the skilled trades and professional and technical occupations.

Order of events for the contest:

Beginning at 8:00 AM

- Judges will check students' attire, and will check for medical form
- Instructions will be given for completing the contest
- Contestants will be given an opportunity to ask questions
- Written test, and any other materials, will be distributed
- Contest will start when judges make the announcement to begin
- Contestants work on contest
- If contestant finishes before the 2 hour limit, he/she may raise his/her hand to be excused. Test and scratch paper will be collected.
- Contest will end 2 hours after the start of the contest. Test and scratch paper will be collected.

Equipment and materials supplied by the **contestant**:

- 2 x #2 pencils (sharpened) or mechanical pencils
- Eraser
- Medical form behind ID badge. No participation without medical form.
- Scientific hand-held calculator (Graphing calculator is permitted, but not required.)

Equipment and materials supplied by the **technical committee**:

- 50 test problems
- Scratch paper (to be returned at end of contest)
- Formula/conversion/reference sheets (to be returned at end of contest)
- Tables and chairs.

Official SkillsUSA attire, or business-like, professional dress is required. Nothing identifying the student or school may be displayed. No eating or drinking during the contest. Communication devices must be turned off and not visible. Show up on time. No résumé required.

In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the contestant who finished the test in the shortest time.
