See appendix below for examples.</li> <li>Each competitor team must work independently without assistance from instructors, other teams or observers. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.</li> <li>Cell phones, iPads/tablets, smart watches, wearable technology or any other electronic communication device is prohibited in the competition area.</li> <li>Only competitors, judges and event staff are allowed in the competition area at any time. Observation is limited to the area designated by the judges or event staff, if applicable. Outdoor competition area may only be accessed by judges, competitors and event staff. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.</li> <li>No one may contact judges in any way and at any time without the expressed permission of the competition coordinator.</li> </ul>

Clothing	Work Attire: Field specific work clothing required for the work environment or that matches the service conditions for the contest. This may include jeans if they are clean and professional looking and are accepted in the respective field (no holes or overly soiled pants). Work shoes or boots with a hard sole or antislip properties (steel toes may be required – refer to <b>Provided by Contestant</b> section below). Clothing should be as such that it will not get caught in moving equipment or power tools. School uniforms may be worn if they meet the above requirements with all identifiers covered.
