<b>Location</b>	Mid-East CTC - Zanesville 400 Richards Road Zanesville, OH 43701 Room 3113	<b>Contest Time</b>	Immediately following orientation (CLOSED contest)
<b>Scope of Contest</b>	<p>The competition will include activities that simulate situations encountered by criminal investigation professionals. See appendix below for examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Each competitor team must work independently without assistance from instructors, other teams or observers. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.</li> <li>● Cell phones, iPads/tablets, smart watches, wearable technology or any other electronic communication device is prohibited in the competition area.</li> <li>● Only competitors, judges and event staff are allowed in the competition area at any time. Observation is limited to the area designated by the judges or event staff. Outdoor competition area may only be accessed by judges, competitors and event staff. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.</li> <li>● No one may contact judges in any way and at any time without the expressed permission of the competition coordinator.</li> </ul>

<b>Eligibility</b>	1 team for every 50 members enrolled in program		
<b>Clothing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Work Attire: Field specific work clothing required for the work environment or that matches the service conditions for the contest. This may include jeans if they are clean and professional looking and are accepted in the respective field (no holes or overly soiled pants).</li> <li>● Work shoes or boots with a hard sole or anti-slip properties (steel toes may be required – refer to <b>Provided by Contestant</b> section below).</li> <li>● Clothing should be as such that it will not get caught in moving equipment or power tools. School uniforms may be worn if they meet the above requirements with all identifiers covered.</li> </ul>		
<b>Provided by Contestant</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Professional Resume – must be typed and physically produced as a hard copy</li> <li>● Emergency Medical Form (Contestants must have this to compete)</li> <li>● Crime scene kit containing materials necessary to conduct a crime scene investigation, e.g., fingerprint cards, brushes, powder, crime scene tape, etc.</li> <li>● Small pocket notebook for field notes</li> <li>● Pens and pencils</li> <li>● Handcuffs and handcuff case</li> </ul>		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Flashlight</li> <li>• Digital camera (any style – quality of photography will not be judged)</li> <li>• Safety glasses with side shields or goggles (prescription glasses with side shields. If not, they must be covered with goggles). Note: Safety eyewear must be available, but use will depend on the scenario</li> </ul>
