Scope of Contest	<p>This competition assesses public speaking skills through delivery of a five- to seven-minute speech:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The topic for the prepared speech will be SkillsUSA: No Limit. • The speech will be five to seven minutes in length. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Penalty: Five points will be deducted for each 30 seconds or fraction thereof under five minutes, or for each 30 seconds or fraction thereof over seven minutes. • Time limit: Time will be started when the speech begins. The timer will signal the speaker at five minutes and at seven minutes. The competitor will be permitted to use a watch or clock. • No visual aids, props, notes and/or notecards will be permitted. • Competitors will not mention their name, school, city or state at any time in the presentation room. A five-point penalty will be assessed for each occurrence. <p><i>Please see judging rubric at end of document.</i></p>
