Prospect St. Smithville, Ohio 44677Contest TimeImmediately following orientation (CLOSED contest)Scope of ContestThis competition evaluates each competitor's ability to give a speech on an assigned topic with a minimum of advance preparation. A three- to five-minute speech will be delivered with a preparation time of five minutes:• The technical committee will select a speech topic based upon material in the <i>SkillsUSA Framework Fundamentals Cards</i> and <i>SkillsUSA Member Handbook</i> . All competitors will be assigned the same topic.• Competitors will enter the preparation room, where they will be given a speech topic and will have five minutes to develop and organize the content of their speech.• During preparation time, competitors may consult reference materials supplied in the preparation room and may make notes on 3" x 5" cards for use during the speech. Competitors may not take any outlines, notes or reference materials into the preparation room.• The speech shall be at least three minutes in length but shall not exceed firm minutes
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 five minutes. Penalty: Five points will be deducted for each 30 seconds or fraction thereof under three minutes, or for each 30 seconds or fraction thereof over five minutes. Time limit: Time will be started when the speech begins. The timekeeper will signal the speaker at three minutes, four minutes and five minutes. Competitors will be permitted to use a watch or clock. Competitors will not mention their name, school, city or state at any time in the presentation room. A five-point penalty will be assessed for each occurrence.
