Requirements for the print are as follows: 		

	 Print size must be no more/less than approx. 80 sq. inches (e.g., 8x10, 10x8, 7x11, 9x9, etc.) Must be mounted on a white ¼" foam board measuring 11"x14" in either a vertical or horizontal orientation No widow matts and no identification of any kind on print or board. The total thickness of the finished piece to be a foam core, white board. Adheres to no specific theme. Can be color, black & white, toned, straight, manipulated, any subject, etc. Print will be submitted at the orientation portion of contest. A label will be given to the student indicating their contestant number. This is to be placed in lower right-hand corner on the front of the mount board.
