<p>Special Notes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Exhibit Halls do not open to observers until 12:00 pm. ▪ Each contestant will be given a check list of workstations. ▪ Each contestant will rotate through and complete each scenario/workstation. ▪ Each contestant will be scored by each individual workstation judge or judges. ▪ Gender integrity will be maintained at workstations required physical contact. ▪ Contestant must be able to complete a physical fitness test IAW OPOYA requirements (Cooper Standard Fitness Test.) ▪ Failure to bring required equipment will result in a reduction in scoring. ▪ The following will not be tolerated and are grounds for disqualification from the competition. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ No smart watches and/or phones are permitted during the contest and/or in contest ○ No contact with anyone outside of the contest area once the contest begins ○ No inappropriate communication between contestants such as verbally degrading another contestant. ○ No cheating on any portion of the contest such as informing another contestant of the skills/test prior to competing.

Resume	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ In conjunction with National Standards, violations may result in student loss of contest. ▪ All SkillsUSA Ohio State Championship Contest will require a short interview component. Students should be prepared with basic job interview skills.
