Scope of Contest	 The competition will include activities that simulate situations encountered by criminal justice professionals. See appendix below for examples. Each competitor team must work independently without assistance from instructors, other teams or observers. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor. Cell phones, iPads/tablets, smart watches, wearable technology or any other electronic communication device is prohibited in the competition area. Only competitors, judges and event staff are allowed in the competition area at any time. Observation is limited to the area designated by the judges or event staff. Outdoor competition area may only be accessed by judges, competitors and event staff. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor. No one may contact judges in any way and at any time without the expressed permission of the competition coordinator.
