Scope of Contest	<p>The competition will include activities that simulate situations encountered by criminal justice professionals. See appendix below for examples.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each competitor team must work independently without assistance from instructors, other teams or observers. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.• Cell phones, iPads/tablets, smart watches, wearable technology or any other electronic communication device is prohibited in the competition area.• Only competitors, judges and event staff are allowed in the competition area at any time. Observation is limited to the area designated by the judges or event staff. Outdoor competition area may only be accessed by judges, competitors and event staff. Any violation of this may disqualify the competitor.• No one may contact judges in any way and at any time without the expressed permission of the competition coordinator.

These devices cannot be used as a calculator.○ No contact with anyone outside of the contest area once the contest begins.○ No inappropriate communication between contestants such as verbally degrading another contestant or informing another contestant of the skills/test prior to or during the competition.○ No cheating on any portion of the contest.○ The use of AI is strictly prohibited and will result in an automatic disqualification of the contestant.
